## Key messages

- One of the first international organizations
- Postal experts, not diplomats
- 1874, Berne, Switzerland
- Successful model
- Important example → revolutionary
- Chaotic internationally before UPU
- 22 countries → Treaty of Berne
- Uniform postal rates → single postal territory

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by Command of Mer Majesty.


1874 Treaty of Berne



#### Main aspects


- High level postal officials

# High level postal officials

- 1863, Paris, 31 resolutions agreed on
- Paris resolutions basis for 1874 Treaty of Berne
- Messages are ancient
- National posts developed
  in 16th 19<sup>th</sup> century
- 2<sup>nd</sup> oldest international organization – UPU!



## Postal experts

- Shared similar problems
- Bonds forged
- Positive atmosphere
- Today's delegates are postal experts, not diplomats
- Longevity: technical, "nonpolitical"
- Exclusively postal matters
- Technical experts diplomats



# International Bureau (IB)

- Secretariat
  - operational work → carry
    out the innovative solutions
- Rules implemented in Berne
- IB/secretariat idea copied
- Switze<del>rla</del>nd, neutral country
- Berne Geneva
- Fewer working groups
